01 WINNING learning for the child

A graphic adventure

A progressive method


Because children will first learn the right hand, then the left hand, while learning to read notes and playing in time, they will have time to integrate the notions of rhythm, listening, notes and the position of the hand.

Polyphony is approached from the seventh piece.

Exercises to work at home punctuate the method by following the concepts studied in class for a better fluidity of the course and the progress of the children.

Individual pieces

From chapter 2, children will also have the opportunity to work on pieces individually. They will apply the concepts learned together.

Structured courses

In order for the learning to be as progressive and structured as possible, the notions of reading notes and rhythms are presented in such a way that the pupils adopt the right working reflexes: always play by saying the name of the notes while respecting the rhythm and the pulse.




Game at the end of a chapter

At the end of chapters 1,2,3 and 4, a musical game makes it possible to evaluate the group on the notions of theories approached in class and to maintain its homogeneity.

Répertoire

The 6-hand repertoire is discussed in Chapter 5. These pieces can be presented during the end-of-year auditions.



05 Caroline Fauchet, pianist

At the heart of music

Caroline Fauchet, French pianist, from a family of musicians studied at the Music Conservatory of Saint-Germain-en-Laye where she obtained at the age of 14 two gold medals (piano and chamber music) then at the Ecole Normale de Musique in Paris in the class of Germaine Mounier. She won numerous prizes and awards, including second prize at the Sofia International Competition and the Albert Roussel Interpretation Prize.

Portrait of a passionate pianist

In 2023 she created the piano concerto in C minor by Yves Levêque. The creation will take place at the University of Saint-Andrews in September 2023. This concerto has won numerous international prizes (World Classical Music Award, Royal Music Competition, Royal Sound Music Competition, etc.). The disc will be released under the Calliope Indésens Record label in September 2023. 05 Caroline Fauchet, teacher and author


A musician committed to teaching
